RUSSIA EXECUTES 10 FOR PLOTTING STALIN MURDER

MOSCOW, Nov. 9.— (\mathcal{P}) —Seventeen men, including ten terrorists convicted of plotting an attempt to assassinate Josef Stalin, general secretary of the communist party, were reported executed today.

A Tiflis newspaper reported those shot for the assassination plots were accused of taking orders from an alleged Trotzkyist center in Moscow. It said they confessed several unsuccessful attempts to kill Stalin in 1933 and 1935. Two of those executed were brothers of the late Nestor Lakoba, a former president of the Abkhazian republic. One of them, Mikhail Lakoba, once served as a bodyguard of Leon Trotzky before his exile.

Others reported shot included four convicted of grain spoiling in Tadjikistan, another in Turkmenistan, and two convicted of raiding collective farms in Uzbekistan.
